

Low skilled adults are one of the groups that is strongly influenced from the effects of the recent financial crisis that has hit the European Union, and a large part of the world. Several publication and researches have certified this data, stressing that one of the problems that has most hampered the integration of adults with low skills in the labour market is the lack of adequate training. In particular, adults with low numeracy and digital skills are characterized by poor health conditions, lower income, less active involvement in society and a substantial risk of social exclusion.

The European project IntoDigits, funded by the Erasmus + program, intends to intervene filling this gap. IntoDigits suggests an integrated approach, specifically designed for the target group, for the provision of a training course aimed at developing numeracy and digital skills.

The project will develop 2 Qualification Frameworks on Numeracy and Digital competences and 42 digital tools for trainers useful for the implementation of activities and workshops that will facilitate the achievement of the Active Citizenship by participants. The Active Citizenship ladder was introduced by another European project, EMKIT, which constitutes an important milestone for the IntoDigits partnership.

The project sees the participation of a transnational partnership of 6 organizations from 6 Member States.
